Two \$75,000 OTRF Stakes Friday at Belterra

A pair of \$75,000 Ohio Thoroughbred Race Fund stakes for Buckeye-bred runners will be contested on Friday, July 17, each traveling one and 1/16 miles over the Belterra Park turf course. The 11th running of the Tomboy Stakes features 11 Ohio-registered 3-year-old fillies, while the Buckeye Native Stakes sees 12 Ohio-accredited 3-year-olds and upward battle.

The \$75,000 Tomboy Stakes—set as the fourth race on the program with a post of 2:02 pm, ET—is headed up by **Ting Tang**, who captured the \$75,000 Cincinnati Stakes on July 3 at Belterra. The daughter of City Weekend is one of a quartet of fillies who hail from the Robert Gorham Stable in the Tomboy. A winner of \$93,316 lifetime, Ting Tang is owned by Mast Thoroughbreds, who also own the other three fillies: Texas Sugar, Tiz What and Edge of Night, who was second to her stablemate in the Cincinnati.

Last season's \$150,000 Galbreath winner **Moonlit Mission** also vies in the Tomboy for trainer Silvano Gonzalez and owner Charlie Williams. This chestnut daughter by Shackleford also won the 2019 edition of the \$75,000 Tah Dah stakes and was third in the \$75,000 Petro Memorial in her lone start this season on June 18 at Thistledown. She sports a bankroll of \$182,050.

Multiple stakes winner **Mobil Solution** is the clear standout in the \$75,000 Buckeye Native Stakes, carded as the seventh race on the afternoon program, with a post time of 3:29 pm, ET. This 5-year-old gelding by Mobil-Perfect Solution, by Seeking the Gold captured the \$75,000 Lewis Memorial Stakes on June 18 at Thistledown in his second start of the season for trainer Jeff Radosevich. Mobil Solution was third in this same stake last year and second in the 2018 Buckeye Native. He has amassed \$465,520 in his career.
